

As a kindergartner, Todd hated finger-painting. "Those rubber gloves were so hot!" But it was good training for his future career as a business humorist. His message is simple: we all mess up communicating...and we're hilarious.

You'll howl as he acts out voice mail greetings, showing how we waste 240 hours each year waiting for the beep. And his recollection of junior high English teacher Miss Reiser will bring back memories of your own (fond or otherwise).
